Enclose phrases in quotation marks → "research skills" full-text AND

Use * to search for word variants → librar* full-text AND

Limit to articles unless you would like another format →

Type: Article Review Editorial Other

Date Range: 2002 to 2005
(specify dates as yyyy, yyyy/mm, or yyyy/mm/dd)

Article Language: English

Narrow your search to specific groups of journals by checking the boxes beside the desired disciplines →

Discipline(s) and/or Journal(s):
 African American Studies (8 journals)

Advantages of Using Advanced Search

- Allows quicker refinement of your search through the “Modify Your Search” command on the results screen
- Allows you to limit results by document type and date, as well as by other limiters, including discipline-specific groups of journals
- Allows you to search for words in different fields at the same time (e.g. Israel in article title and “national identity” in full-text)
